

Short bio: Dr. Donald R. Fuller

Dr. Fuller has been a member of higher education in the United States for 31 years. He is currently a professor and chair of the Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders at The University of Texas Rio Grande Valley. Dr. Fuller received his doctoral training in AAC at Purdue University under the mentorship of one of the field's pioneers, the late Dr. Lyle Lloyd. Dr. Fuller's primary interests in AAC include theoretical and terminological issues in the field, characteristics of aided and unaided AAC symbols, and technological advancements and issues. Along with Dr. Lloyd and Dr. Helen Arvidson, Dr. Fuller co-edited the 1997 textbook Augmentative and Alternative Communication: A Handbook of Principles and Practices and is currently completing an updated textbook (along with Dr. Lloyd, posthumously) entitled Principles and Practices in Augmentative and Alternative Communication, which is set for publication in March 2021. He is a Fellow of the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association.



Dr. Eliada Pampoulou

Dr. Pampoulou is a Lecturer in the Department of Rehabilitation Sciences at Cyprus University of Technology. She is a Speech and Language Therapist and an Assistive Technology Specialist. Her research interests relate to the nascent area in Cyprus of Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC). Specifically, her focus is on the quality of AAC assessment and intervention outcomes as well as AAC systems acceptance. Her research interests also relate to the use of graphic symbols-for people with complex communication needs. As part of her contribution to wider society, she has presented several seminars and workshops during which she has trained both professionals and parents on issues concerning the AAC field. She is a member of the Cyprus Association of Registered Speech-Language Pathologists.
